



THE "ST. AYLOTT" COLLECTION OF NEWFOUNDLAND

If you have been interested in the stamps of Newfoundland for even a short period of time you cannot help but be impressed by this collection, which we have broken down into some five hundred lots. With nearly forty years of experience and thirty years of public auctions behind me, I marvelled at the literally dozens of items that one almost never sees, including many that we have never previously handled. A review of the catalogue will reveal extremely rare items, many of which have graced famous collections like those of

Sidney Harris, Dale-Liechtenstein, Dr. Chan Chin Cheung and Sir Gawaine Baillie.

Consider for a moment the pence die proofs and plate proofs, and the three "CANCELLED" singles (lots 26-28). These are followed by complete mint sheets, a fantastic assembly to which we have devoted a separate section. Then have a look at some inverted overprint errors including a pair of the L & S Post and one of the best showings ever of the Halifax Airmail. Other areas are less obvious including three of my favourites -- a spectacular holding of Sperati forgeries, a fascinating group of trial essays of the 1897 surcharged issue including the unique cover (lots 230-243) and the Caribou Issue proofs. The key provisional airmails are also present, with choice mint singles of the Hawker, de Pinedo, and all four settings of the Columbia.


Equally impressive is the overall condition of this collection. The difficulty of finding sound examples of many Newfoundland stamps is well known. However, the vast majority of lots here are entirely fault free, rarities included. This is a truly remarkable achievement in today's market.

We are extremely proud and pleased to present this collection. I am sure that any collector will be equally proud to add some of these gems to his or her collection. Indeed, the auction represents a unique opportunity to expand one's existing holdings or embark on a new specialty.

NEWFOUNDLAND PENCE ISSUE PROOFS

NEWFOUNDLAND

First Issue. 1st January 1857.

The only original plate proofs known to exist were one sheet of each value in black on .015" thick card and only one sheet of each value was produced in proof form. The total number of proofs of each value are thus determined by the number of of stamps in the respective sheets when issued which were as follows.

1d 120 stamps. 2d 20 stamps. 3d 80 stamps. 4d 20 stamps. 5d 40 stamps. 6d 20 stamps. 6'rd 20 stamps. 8d 20 stamps. 1/- 20 stamps.

It is rare to find a complete set of these original plate proofs which were completed in September 1856 with the actual stamps being issued on the 1st January 1857.





THE PERKINS BACON "CANCELLED" STAMPS



In August 1861, Perkins Bacon provided six or fewer copies of each denomination to Pearson Hill, eldest son of Sir Rowland Hill, for members of the family. The stamps were obliterated with a barred oval handstamp "CANCELLED". According to the detailed research and illustrated census compiled by Peter Jaffé * (see below for reference), the following values have been seen and reported by the author. The first figure is the number currently known, while the second figure is the number of other examples that may possibly exist:

1860 1sh orange (2; 0) 1861-1862 4p rose (1; 3) 3p green (3; 1) 6p rose (3; 3) – updated census 4p orange (2; 0) 6½p rose (3; 4) 1sh rose (2; 2)
```

A total of 18 examples "CANCELLED" have been reported so far, including the newly discovered example of a 6p rose. Four examples including a 5p red brown, 1sh orange, 6p rose and a 6½p rose reside in the Royal Collection; leaving a mere 14 examples available to the public.

THE HALIFAX AIRMAIL INVERTED OVERPRINTS

In 1921 plans were underway in Newfoundland to connect the capital of St. John's to Botwood, Labrador and Halifax, Nova Scotia by regular flights. The possibility for improved mail service was soon recognized, and work began on a new airmail stamp to satisfy the projected demand. As a good supply of the 35c Cabot Issue was still on hand, it was decided to overprint this stamp, saving both time and money.

The "Halifax" airmail was issued November 7, 1921. Fourteen thousand stamps were issued in sheets of twenty-five. There were two printings of five thousand and nine thousand respectively. While not a foolproof test, the first printing is identifiable by a heavier and blacker impression, while the second is somewhat lighter and more grayish.

The Halifax airmail presents an excellent opportunity for specialization. There are six major types of overprint varieties in addition to the two printings mentioned above. These overprint varieties are now listed in the catalogues. Blocks or full sheets showing the various types are particularly desirable. There are also covers to collect.

Of prime importance to collectors however is a major error -- four sheets received an inverted overprint in error. Boggs stated that three sheets exist, but four are documented in the excellent reference work *Newfoundland Air Mails 1919-1939* by Dalwick and Harmer. This book is a must for all students of Newfoundland aero-philately. The difference in the two reference works prompted us to do a census of all known examples; this proved conclusively that four sheets do indeed exist.

Each of these four sheets sheet is identifiable by the placement of the overprint. While the descriptions below may at first sound somewhat confusing, they become crystal clear when looking at actual stamps, and fortunately the St. Atlott collection has no less than eleven mint singles. Here is an example of each sheet along with the identifying characteristics as presented in Dalwick and Harmer:



Sheet (1) Overprint well centered vertically and horizontally.



Sheet (3) Overprint very low with horizontal perforations cutting through 1921". Vertical perforations cut "t" of "to".



Sheet (2)
Vertically in centre of stamp, horizontally to right.



Sheet (4) Overprint low but with horizontal perforations above "1921" and the "t" of "to" not cut through.

The extreme rarities of these inverted overprints is soon realized when one considers the small number printed together with the variations of the four different sheets. Only four to forty exist of each of the six major settings exist, but when you include the differences between sheets this number becomes a mere one to ten of each (see numbers below in parenthesis). Lot 438 is in fact unique, and there are only two known of lot 439.

Sheets three and four present another interesting variety. On the lower row of each sheet the "1921" does not appear -- a total of just ten stamps! Three blocks and a vertical pair are known to us, two of the blocks showing the very rare "1" under "f" settings. The other three have yet to be accounted for, but in my opinion are very desirable items.

Here is a summary of the eleven mint examples included in the St. Aylott collection:


