



#### THE DENNINGER COLLECTION

It is indeed an honour to have been selected as auctioneers for this outstanding property. Over a lifetime, 'Denninger' was able to assemble one of the most comprehensive collections of British North America ever formed. It was built with patience and enthusiasm, in a dedicated quest to acquire not only each basic stamp, but also the listed varieties, shades, errors and bisect usages on cover. As a further challenge he collected every stamp both mint and used, truly a mammoth undertaking. The Unitrade catalogue became his want list and a record of



his acquisitions, and there are thousands of check-marks in it. The presence of virtually every Canada, British Columbia, Maritime Provinces and Newfoundland stamp, from classic issues to modern errors, is truly breathtaking.

Over several decades, his eagerness to search for needed items never diminished, as the scope of the collection was wide enough to maintain his interest and intellectual curiosity. The collection excels in many areas. For example, Canadian semi-official airmails, unique modern errors and the spectacular array of bisected stamps come to mind. Many of the great rarities originate from other important collections of the past and are frequently in the very best condition attainable.

#### Sale 2 – Canada Part One – A Summary

Canadian Philately has been our bread and butter for over forty years. With continuous commitment, we have become a preferred source for rare proofs, stamps and postal history. Clients often ask us: "Have you seen this before?" or "What do you think about this lot in the auction?"

When we initially examined the 'Denninger' collection we were not only surprised by its comprehensiveness, but also by the number of rare items we had never previously handled. In the end we decided to dedicate an entire sale to the airmails of Canada & Newfoundland (Sale 3 to be offered in Winter 2025), only our second auction totally devoted to aerophilately.

Due to the vast amount of material, we also thought it best to offer the Canadian material in two separate sales. Each will offer a fabulous range of material from Pence issues right up to striking modern errors. The diversity of the lots, combined with their rarity, is particularly noteworthy. There are many items that would be an instant highlight of any auction, offering the collector a great opportunity to acquire items which took 'Denninger' a lifetime of searching.

With readily apparent good-taste, knowledge and sophistication, 'Denninger' went well beyond the scope of a basic collection. The thrill of acquisition over the years resulted in successfully hunting down many elusive printings, varieties and errors. This is particularly evident in the Elizabethan era, which we feel is the best that has ever been assembled. Although currently under-appreciated, the modern era offers a vast field of opportunity for the specialist to focus on. From long-running definitive series to interesting topical-themed commemoratives, imperforates, inverts, missing colours and other major errors are available at reasonable prices. The modern era certainly rivals the more mature, well-trodden earlier areas of specialization.

The 'Denninger' collection offers an astonishing number of early and modern era rarities, many of which are one-of-a-kind, surpassing in numerous ways other important holdings of modern errors of the past. In fact, this will no doubt become the benchmark "name-sale" to measure future collections against.

2 ★ 2, 1851 6p Slate Violet on Handmade Laid Paper, Imperforate An immensely rare mint single, displaying prominent laid lines and strong true colour and impression of Canada's first issue, trivial light soiling, just in outer frameline at foot, well clear to large margins on other sides and remarkably enough still retaining a large part characteristic thin semi-transparent ORIGINAL GUM found on the 1851 laid papers. Advanced collectors are fully aware that a mint Six pence on laid paper with original gum is much scarcer than the more highly catalogued Twelve pence black. An absolute rarity, F-VF OG 90,000.00

Part of backflap missing and tears (repaired) from opening, none of which detract from this exceptional cover, one of only four known 3p bisect usages. Neat "tombstone" Pkt Letter Liverpool 21 SP 1856 transit in red, superb Darlington SP 25 and Barnard Castle SP 25 receiver backstamps. One of the very few remaining mint OG ten pence Cartier stamps on thin paper - in fact the ratio of existing mint examples between the first and the later printing on thicker opaque wove paper should be at least 10:1 - current catalogue values do not reflect this disparity. We do not recall offering a mint example of this stamp in recent years, a major rarity, VF OG

The various grading of stamps are in order; **Extremely Fine; Very Fine; Fine and Very Good.** In the case of sets, large blocks, sheets, etc., the condition quoted represents the average and quality above and below this standard can be expected. Minor perf separation can be expected on larger multiples.

Mixed condition: in large lots, a range of condition can be expected, from small faults to Very Fine.
