







In addition to the large die proofs, six of which are approved and signed by Postmaster General Sir William Mulock, there are an additional medium size and stamp size die proofs. This fabulous range of 36 lots offers a golden opportunity for the specialist to acquire spectacular and seldom seen proofs.
