



### THE DENNINGER COLLECTION

It is indeed an honour to have been selected as auctioneers for this outstanding property. Over a lifetime, 'Denninger' was able to assemble one of the most comprehensive collections of British North America ever formed. It was built with patience and enthusiasm, in a dedicated quest to acquire not only each basic stamp, but also the listed varieties, shades, errors and bisect usages on cover. As a further challenge he collected every stamp both mint and used, truly a mammoth undertaking. The Unitrade catalogue became his want list and a record of



his acquisitions, and there are thousands of check-marks in it. The presence of virtually every Canada, British Columbia, Maritime Provinces and Newfoundland stamp, from classic issues to modern errors, is truly breathtaking.

Over several decades, his eagerness to search for needed items never diminished, as the scope of the collection was wide enough to maintain his interest and intellectual curiosity. The collection excels in many areas. For example, Canadian semi-official airmails, unique modern errors and the spectacular array of bisected stamps come to mind. Many of the great rarities originate from other important collections of the past and are frequently in the very best condition attainable.

### Denninger Sale 3 - Airmails of Newfoundland & Canada - A Summary

Exactly one hundred years ago (on January 19<sup>th</sup>, 1925), the venerable auction house H.R. Harmer on Bond Street in London held the first ever auction dedicated solely to airmails. Since this "day-one" event, aerophilately has intrigued serious collectors worldwide. A mark of any great collection was the presence of one or more Newfoundland rarities, such as the Hawker, Martynside, De Pinedo and Columbia stamps and flight covers. Over the following decades, the collecting of airmails caught the attention of new generations of dedicated philatelists. Many wrote detailed handbooks and catalogues on the subject and built specialized collections, not only on Newfoundland but also on airmail stamps and postal history from many other countries, regions and special "niche" areas.

The third installment of the Denninger Collection contains most of the major rarities pertaining to Newfoundland airmails, including the including the above-mentioned items. Also present are invert errors on the 1921 Halifax overprint and the 1930 Dornier DO-X surcharge. The 1931 Pictorial issue imperforate and part-perforate varieties will surely impress even the most seasoned collector. Suffice it to say, we are extremely proud to present this impressive assembly dedicated to the aerophilately of Newfoundland.

The Canada portion of the auction is no less noteworthy, showcasing pioneer flight and semi-official airmail stamps issued by private commercial airlines between 1918 and the mid-1930s. Many of these serviced remote and isolated areas of our vast land in the north. Among the pioneer flight stamps, one will be impressed by mint examples of two very rare stamps - the 1920 Grand Army of Canada and the 1927 London to London. Very few collectors of the past were able to secure both of these stamps for their collections.

Since the exemplary collection of John Cornelius was sold in two parts 1971 & 1972, semi-official airmails have been gaining in popularity. This remarkable collection holds many great rarities that have very seldom appeared, if at all, on the market in this generation. A golden opportunity awaits anyone wanting to acquire these fascinating items, that form an integral part of Canadian postal history.

### THE HAWKER SPECIAL FLIGHT STAMP A WORLD-CLASS AIRMAIL RARITY





501 C1, 1919 (April 12) 3c Hawker Flight Five-Line Overprint An exceptionally fresh mint single of this much sought-after airmail rarity, bright fresh colour and impression on pristine fresh paper, remarkably full original gum showing the faintest hinging imaginable and hardly discernible - would pass as NH for many, normal fine centering for the issue. Customary "J.A.R." manuscript ink initials on reverse applied for validation by Dr J. Alex. Robinson, Postmaster General, along with three different guarantee backstamps. A beautifully fresh mint example of this famous world-class airmail rarity, Fine VLH 20,000.00+

Of the 200 stamps overprinted, 95 were used for franking the mail for the ill-fated flight. Furthermore, 18 defective examples were destroyed, reducing the total to a possible 87 mint examples. After 11 copies were given to officials, the Postmaster General sold the remaining 76 mint examples for \$25 each (at that time!) to raise money for the Newfoundland Marine Disasters Fund, which supported sailors' widows and orphans. It is likely that fewer remain today, more than 100 years after its issue.

502 ⊚ C1, 1919 (April 12) 3c Brown, Hawker Flight Five-Line Overprint The rare pioneer airmail stamp, used with wavy-line cancellation as do the vast majority of known examples, a little soiled from usage and pressed vertical crease but superbly centered which is virtually unheard of for this tremendously difficult stamp; original initials "J.A.R." on reverse partially washed from being signed over the gum and its immersion in seawater after the flight ill-fated crash; subsequently inscribed in ink on reverse: "Post stamp of King George letter taken from plain [sic] in mid Ocean". ### THE "MARTINSYDE" MANUSCRIPT AIRMAIL ON FLOWN COVER



1919 (April 19) "Martinsyde" Attempted Flight cover endorsed by sender "Per Aeroplane 'Raymor' Newfoundland to Britain Kindness of Major Morgan and F.P. Raynham" and bearing a quite well centered 3c brown Caribou with manuscript "Aerial Atlantic Mail" in dark black ink, countersigned "JAR" initials by Postmaster General J. Alex. Robinson; light central cover fold and part of backflap missing, a few small sealed tears at top of cover only. The stamp in the characteristic bright shade is completely sound and neatly tied to the cover by St. John's APR 19 4PM 1919 machine cancellation, addressed to Sir. E.R. Bowring, London, England; reverse shows a clear London F.S. 66 7 JA 20 receiver datestamp as do all "Martinsyde" covers; a Fine cover pencil signed by expert Enzo Diena, bearing a VF example of this great airmail rarity. According to recently published articles and handbooks, the quantity of stamps bearing this manuscript is still unknown. It has been reported that W.D. Campbell, Secretary to the Post Office, once announced "some 50 stamps were so inscribed." After more than a century only eighteen covers have been reported by Jean-Claude Vasseur in his census published in his "Newfoundland Air Mails 1919 / 1939 Part II: Notes" handbook.

The cover is endorsed by sender "By Aerial Post Rolls - Martin - Syde Atlantic Flight" and addressed to Mrs. H.J. Powys-Keck, London, England with characteristic London F.S. 66 7 JA 20 receiver, VF (Unitrade C1a variety; SG 142a footnote)

The revised edition of "Newfoundland Air Mails" by Dalwick & Harmer states: "Since 1953 at least four Martinsyde covers have come to light and two of these are exceptional". They are referring to one cover franked with two 2c Caribous [sold in our Highlands Part II sale, February 2019; Lot 209] and this cover, observed as: "The other envelope, equally exciting and doubtless also unique was sent to a lady in London... must rank amongst the most highly prized airmail covers, although on two attempts they flew only a few hundred yards."

Although the Martinsyde "Raymor" got off the ground before the successful Alcock-Brown Vickers flight, it soon failed, as it did on two other attempts May 18 and July 17, resulting in the airplane being wrecked shortly after takeoff, but without casualties. Shortly after the first attempt, Major Morgan returned to England for medical reasons. After the third attempt, Major Raynham personally hand carried the mailbag upon his return to England by ship; only to be delivered months later to the British postal authorities on January 7 where all known Martinsyde covers were backstamped with the London F.S. 66 7 JA 20 double ring datestamp.

Handley-Page "Atlantic" Flight 1919 (June 9) Cover endorsed "By Aeroplane" and signed at lower left by navigator "KM Grieve" with original handwritten letter enclosure signed by him, franked with a well centered \$1 on 15c airmail with comma after "POST" and period after "1919", postmarked on First Day of Issue with clear St. John's JUN 9 5PM 1919 cancel, forwarded to Harbour Grace for the planned departure where it received a light but clearly legible Harbour Grace JU 14 19 departure CDS; intended for an attempt at the prize for the first transatlantic flight. After technical difficulties the plane took off on July 4th but suffered a forced landing at Parrsboro, Nova Scotia in the early morning of July 5th. The mail was then forwarded to England; no backstamp, slight aging but overall in superior condition for this flight, VF (Unitrade C2)

### THE HALIFAX AIRMAIL INVERTED OVERPRINT A FABULOUS BLOCK OF THE UTMOST RARITY



511 ★ C3a, C3c, C3e, C3k, 1921 35c Halifax Airmail An extraordinary mint block with the INVERTED OVERPRINT ERROR remarkably displaying four different types of the overprint (Positions 4/10 in the pane) now overprinted inverted on Positions 16/22, extremely well centered with intact perforations all around and full clean original gum, small hinging at top to light hinge on lower pair, overall superior condition to what is normally seen on these. A magnificent airmail rarity block capturing two of the rarest airmail overprint types of Newfoundland (Scott C3e & C3k) and in an excellent state of preservation, stunning in all respects; pencil signed by expert Peter Holcombe on reverse, XF 67,500.00

The special airmail stamp was overprinted in red in half sheets of 50, with a total printing of just 300 stamps (six panes). A maximum of 6 examples can exist on and off cover.
