

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

Featuring a remarkable array of appealing "Goodall" die essays and proofs including sought-after compound dies, many depicting the portrait of Charles Connell. The unissued Connell stamp is one of the most infamous and controversial ever prepared for issue by any country.

Postal history is divided into the Pence and Decimal era, mainly organized by rates, with many rarities present. The Pence section features the earliest known usage of a New Brunswick stamp, rare bisect usages and the finest single usage of the one shilling.

The underappreciated yet equally challenging Decimal period includes two very rare 17 cent rate covers to the United Kingdom as well as two different rate covers to Barbados. This section concludes with elusive incoming mail from Britain and from exotic destinations.

This is the latest recorded usage of a six pence bisect and one of only three mailed after May 15, 1860, when New Brunswick Cents issues first appeared. Due to the controversial and immediate removal of the Connell stamp, there was no 5c value until mid-July when the 5c Queen Victoria was issued. Until then, a 3p, a bisected 6p or a bisected 10c could provisionally be used in its place.

The bizarre circumstance which led to the portrait of Postmaster General of New Brunswick being depicted instead of a member of the Royal Family.



Interesting Collateral Material Related to Charles Connell Written up on 17 album pages and housed in a custom-made leather bound album with gold imprint "New Brunswick - Charles Connell".

Includes promissory note to Connell dated 1838 and another on GPO letterhead dated 1859 concerning rail delivery; a 1854 letter signed by him, a rare Connell free frank cover mailed 1859 to the Hampton postmaster, another with Ottawa House of Commons postmarked at Ottawa in 1867; covers to his daughter and her husband, etc. A great lot for the specialist.
