





Of the eight known six-pence bisect covers paying the 3 pence rate to Nova Scotia (see Arfken & Firby "The Pence Covers of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick 1851-1860" on page 134) three are from the same correspondence from Sackville to Amherst; the one offered here is not reported in the census and is in noticeably superior condition.

AN OUTSTANDING DUAL BISECT FRANKING FOR DOUBLE WEIGHT PACKET RATE TO THE UNITED KINGDOM



1858 (July 12) Orange cover from the Miss Smith correspondence, mailed from Saint John to London displaying a fantastic and one-of-a-kind franking consisting of two 6 pence olive yellow each adjacent to a diagonally bisected 3 pence red placed at both upper corners, attractively tied by oval grid 'l' cancels, part St. John dispatch, John Seybold backstamps, a well known pioneer postal history collector; London PAID JY 26 58 split ring receiver in red further ties the bisect at right. Stamps with small flaws or cut in, cover with edge wear and part of backflap missing from wax seal removal. Nevertheless a cover of wonderful appeal and A UNIQUE FRANKING paying a double weight Packet Letter Rate of 15 pence currency for a letter up to one ounce. There are only five Pence covers with 1sh3p frankings; all are known rarities. Less than 5 months later, the rate was reduced on August 1st, 1854 to 7½ pence currency (or 6 pence stg).
